

Today's Take-Aways

Regional Updates

- While we are still in pretty good shape with some sporadic active cases, we have now had a cumulative total of 106 COVID positive cases in Renfrew County since March. There is evidence of community transmission but it's not widespread. Work continues to reinforce the importance of masking, distancing and good hand hygiene. There is also some new information being circulated about home made mask requirements and ways in which Canadians need to learn to safely live with COVID in our communities so more to come on that.
- New direction was given by the Renfrew County and District Health Unit on October 30th with regards to self-isolation in the form of a new order. There have since been some questions brought forward about how this order will impact staff in terms of work isolation. This direction is being reviewed and a decision tree is being developed for asymptomatic staff under various circumstances. Once distribution of this has been approved, it will be shared broadly.
- Universal eye protection has been rolled out in all Renfrew County hospitals and is being well received as an additional safety measure offering protection from any positive cases of COVID.

EORLA

- COVID test turn-around times are currently in the range of 14-17 hours from the time they receive the samples.
 - EORLA will be taking on the testing for the Renfrew County Virtual Triage and Assessment Centre.

Human Resources

• In alignment with the regional approach, we are reinstating temporary paid leave for part-time employees who have been directed by Occupational Health and Safety to self-isolate at home. These temporary benefits don't apply to those employees who are authorized to work under "work self-isolation" or who can work productively from home.

There are three categories which may identify an eligible absence:

- 1. Asymptomatic employees who have had a high risk exposure.
- 2. Employees with symptoms of COVID-19 but no high risk exposure.
- 3. Employees with symptoms of COVID-19 who have had a high risk exposure, as well as employees who have tested positive for COVID-19.

The start of paid leave will coincide with the date of the COVID test and end when a negative result has been received. If you still have symptoms that require you to be off, you will access your sick leave as per your collective agreement and/or terms of reference.

• During the next few months, our hospital, along with 23 other health care organizations in the Champlain region are taking part in a new recruitment campaign under the heading of "Ottawa Health Careers".

As part of this new regional recruitment initiative, hospitals, labs and long-term care facilities have joined together to recruit for a thousand jobs. We want to make sure there is enough staff to support our hospital through the pandemic, and well into the future.

Occupational Health and Safety

- Flu Shot Clinics are now in their second week and as of Tuesday we have had uptake from 236 staff, 27 physicians and eight volunteers/students. While the clinics will continue to "roam", Occupational Health and Safety has also scheduled a number of daily "stationary" clinics continuing next week as follows:
 - 10 a.m. to noon and 3-4 p.m. Stationary clinic in A414 Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday
 - 1- 2:30 p.m. Roaming clinics daily throughout the hospital
 - Due to the Remembrance Day statutory holiday next Wednesday, no flu clinics will take place

Staff need to email to schedule an appointment for the stationary flu clinics. Please indicate your preferred date and time and they will confirm your appointment by email.

Anyone preferring a private appointment to obtain their flu shot can call Occupational Health and Safety at extension 7202 to book.

- Staff can expect to see a process of random audits taking place with regards to the following:
- Breakroom COVID safety measures
- Use of universal eye protection
- Staff screening (paper and electronic)

Clinical Updates

- Emergency department Working on finalizing a new staffing model and the possibility of bringing paramedics into the ED to work.
- Ambulatory Clinics Work continues on reducing the waitlist for stress tests. There are now about 45 patients waiting for an appointment.

• Please note that due to the November 11th statutory holiday for Remembrance Day, next week's edition of The Pulse will come out on November 10th.


GRATITUDE


