News Related to COVID-19

Regional Updates

• A regional framework has been created for hospital Visitor policies. This framework has been reviewed to ensure ours is aligned. At this time there will be no changes to the policy, however there will be some enhanced communication about the policy with patients and their families upon admission and signage about the policy is being mounted in patient rooms, common areas on the units and in the Tower A and B elevators.

• Ottawa hospitals are still experiencing great challenges around occupancy and are looking to others in the region for opportunities to relieve some of these pressures.



• Recognizing that most hospitals have a lot of pressures to provide acute care, the province has tasked the Ministry of

Home and Community Care with to lead the support to long-term care.

EORLA

• Given some of the recent COVID cases, EORLA is once again seeing an increase in testing demand meaning that turn-around times may be longer than usual until their planned increased capacity kicks in at the end of November.

Supplies and PPE

• Our PPE supply status remains strong with gloves still outstanding as a global challenge due to supply issues. Our hospital will be taking advantage of an opportunity to purchase a large quantity of ear loop masks which will amount to a six-month supply.

• Effective November 2nd we will be implementing universal eye protection for all staff during patient encounters. More communication will be rolled out on this by the end of the week.

Occupational Health and Safety

• Flu Shot Clinics launched this week and as of noon on Tuesday we already had uptake from 89 staff and 12 physicians! While the clinics will continue to "roam", Occupational Health and Safety will also be scheduling a number of daily "stationary" clinics starting next week as follows:

- 10 a.m. to noon Stationary clinic in A414
- 1-2:30 p.m. Roaming clinic throughout the hospital
- 3 4 p.m. Stationary clinic in A414
- There will also be a roaming clinic Nov. 2, 4 and 5 from 4-8:30 p.m.

Occupational Health and Safety Continued

Clinical Updates

• Please note that, due to a global shortage of COVID testing swabs, staff will notice a variety of different products/swabbing kits being used and in circulation.

• Staff and physicians must complete a point-of-care risk assessment prior to each patient interaction and select the PPE appropriate for the task. Staff and physicians must be knowledgeable of Aerosol Generating Procedures (AGMPs) and, when it is appropriate, utilize an N95 respirator and airborne precautions. For an up-to-date list of AGMPs, refer to the "Respiratory Procedures Generating Droplet Aerosols" Policy in Policy Medical.

• In order to provide some assistance to our regional partners, over the next several months our orthopaedic surgeons will be taking on some hip and knee procedures locally for those patients from the Ottawa area who have had extended wait times for their surgeries.

• Our Diagnostic Imaging department is also looking at supporting patients from Ottawa area hospitals who require CT scans with additional appointments opening up for those patients.

Pharmacy




