#### News Related To COVID-19

#### **Regional Updates**

• Across the region we are experiencing a shortage of COVID-19 throat swabs. As a result, hospitalized patients will only receive nose swabs.

• Due to the overcapacity in hospitals in Ottawa, there are many discussions taking place around the utilization of acute care beds in the region. The reason for their overcapacity is the high number of ALC (Alternate Level of Care) patients now exceeding 700.

• A new Visitor Policy framework has been approved. While Renfrew County hospitals will maintain their current policies, there will be some review of the areas where our policies may not be aligned.

• A new Medical Directive around swabbing is in the final approval stages. More to come on this.

• EORLA is still on track to expand their testing capacity to 6,000 per day by the end of November.

• Two new guidelines are being introduced at the regional level. The first is with regards to patients who are unable to wear masks. Our PPE Committee is going to review this to determine if any amendments are required at PRH in order to align with this.

The second addresses paid leave for staff based on specific COVID-related criteria. The HR Committee will be reviewing this new guideline.

#### Supplies and PPE

• We appear to have a solid supply of PPE based on current usage.

• Materials Management will be sourcing additional face shields to accommodate a planned move to universal eye protection.

#### **Occupational Health and Safety**

• Flu Shot Clinics – It's that time of the year! Occupational Health and Safety will be launching **roaming** Flu Shot Clinics throughout the organization for ALL staff and physicians starting the week of October 26th. These roaming clinics will continue for several weeks in both the clinical and nonclinical areas. When attending a Flu Shot Clinic, please ensure there is appropriate physical distancing from others and try to wear clothing that allows for easy access to your upper arm/shoulder. Anyone preferring a private appointment to obtain their flu shot can call Occupational Health and Safety at extension 7202 to book.

#### **Clinical Updates**

• Critical Care – Nursing staff will receive refresher training on high flow oxygen while mock exercises on massive transfusion protocols (code omega) will be run for ED, OR and lab staff.

• Emergency Department/ICU – different staffing models are being explored to help alleviate some of the current challenges.

• Medical – Six nursing students (mix of RNs and RPNs) who are in their final year of training will be assisting ALC and dementia patients on 3B under the designation of Clinical Care Assistants (CCAs). This will be a welcome addition as they take on supportive roles for these patients.

• Surgical/OR – The department is continuing to explore ways to support regional partners in terms of surgical cases.


