Today's Take-Aways

Regional Updates

• The Renfrew County and District Health Unit in partnership with the Renfrew County Virtual Triage and Assessment Centre have adopted new guidelines for self-monitoring for any asymptomatic household members of symptomatic individuals. These guidelines were outlined in a memo "COVID-19 Testing" that was sent out earlier today to staff and physicians.

• A new, comprehensive reference document regarding COVID-19 symptoms has been issued by Ontario Health this week that is currently being reviewed by Infection Prevention and Control. Watch for further information which should help provide clarity on symptom identification.

• The Renfrew County Virtual Triage and Assessment Centre is seeking support with their swabbing clinics. We will be reviewing staff availability to see if we have any resources that could be redeployed for this purpose.

• The Renfrew County and District Health Unit is preparing to launch a major flu shot campaign for the public and as part of this, has leased a large building in which to run flu shot clinics. Regionally we are working with public health, primary care and EMS to see how all of us can assist in providing flu shots to the community in a coordinated manner.

Human Resources

• In order to provide support to our Occupational Health and Safety team, a sub-committee of our Operations Committee has been formed to deal specifically with Occ. Health issues. Jennifer Kennedy will be the lead on this.

Supply Status

• While there continues to be some challenges in securing an adequate supply of gloves for the region, generally PPE supply is in good standing without any impending deficiencies. PRH is exploring a purchase partnership with other hospitals in the region to address the glove supply issues.

Clinical News

• We are in the process of creating two additional negative pressure rooms – one in the ICU and one in our Emergency Department.

• Operating Room – we are starting to see some cancellations of surgeries taking place related to failed COVID screening for patients as well as staff and physicians who are at home awaiting COVID swabbing results for themselves or their family members.

• Ambulatory Clinics – the Stress room is back in use and the department is working on clearing the backlog of approximately 100 patients who were awaiting Stress tests.

• After reviewing some of the lessons learned from the first months of the pandemic, some additional education will be scheduled regarding the early signs and symptoms of COVID-19. Watch for more details on this in the coming weeks.

Today's Take Aways...Continued From Front

• A number of organizations in Renfrew County, including Mental Health Services of Renfrew County, who partnered on an application for United Way funding to support virtual care are now benefitting from that allocation. The funding has been used to hire a Virtual Care Coordinator as well as provide virtual care resources for clients including phone cards, phone, data etc.

PPE

• Clinical staff can expect to receive some "refresher" education in the coming weeks on proper PPE selection as well as the donning and doffing processes.

Rehab Roof/Deck Project:

The water was drained from the roof following a successful flood test with no water leaks. The roofer started installing the first layer of 10 cm of foam insulation and the grey border paving stones. The lightning arresting system (lightning rods and wiring for protection) was reinstated.

Tower A Roof Project:

The contractor started to build up the roof edges with lumber and installed guarding around the perimeter. The crane will be back on site tomorrow to lift more material and to remove a large communication dish from the penthouse roof.

Electronic Staff Self-Screening Tool

- Before arriving at work, you must complete the online self-screening questionnaire (located on the Staff Resources section of the PRH website) or via the QR code below, or fill out a paper copy at the staff entrance.
- If you pass screening, you will be able to come in to work, if you fail screening, you will be asked to contact <u>Occupational Health and Safety at ext. 8200</u>
- Staff entering PRH via the staff entrance will be able to wear a cloth mask from home until they reach their workplace and can switch out for a procedure mask.
- Staff entering through any other entrance where active screening remains will be asked to show their electronic screening email or fill out a paper form so screening can be tracked.
