Today's Take-Aways

COVID-19

• There has been a tremendous influx of information, guidance and direction from Ontario Health with regards to COVID-19 and in particular, the impact of the Omicron variant over the weekend.

Many aspects of the COVID-19 response are once again being ramped up and reactivated including the provincial Incident Management Structure (IMS).

We are also receiving some positive news with regards to how the province is supporting hospitals with their staffing challenges however we don't expect resolution of this overnight.

Today's Take-Aways Continued

• We are also in the process of reviewing some helpful information which was received yesterday with regards to how to safely return health care workers to work given the current isolation guidance. Occupational Health will be making use of a new Decision Guide to safely manage individual staff members. This could include increased use of rapid testing.

COVID-19 Vaccination (3rd Dose)

• Recognizing that the best defence against the new Omicron variant is vaccination, our region continues to ramp up vaccination efforts and our hospital is once again assisting the Renfrew County and District Health Unit with this led by retirees John and Trudi Wren, Debbie Wegner and Holly Woermke. To facilitate this, the Pembroke clinic will be moved into the former call centre building in the city's west end. It is hoped that by the end of February, all those wishing to be vaccinated with a third dose will have had the opportunity to do so.

Occupational Health and Safety / Infection Prevention and Control

- There are new directives coming into effect Dec. 22nd with regards to the use of N95 masks in high risk hospital settings which will impact everyone who has direct contact with patients who are suspected (based on specific criteria which will be communicated) or confirmed to have COVID-19. At PRH this will include those on the COVID Unit and in the ED/ICU as well as DI, Lab and Environmental Services staff who would have direct contact with those patients and/or their environment. A detailed memo on these changes will be issued Dec. 21st. Staff can anticipate a rollout of N95 Fit Testing in the coming days as well as education around the donning and doffing of N95 masks.
- In conjunction with the new guidance, staff will see new signage indicating areas where N95 masks are required.
- It should be noted that as the Omicron variant is now widespread there is no longer a focus on screening specifically for international travel.

Medical

• Please be aware that we have reinstated the Designated COVID Unit on Medical 2A South Wing. To minimize traffic through the Designated COVID Unit, we are asking all staff to refrain from using the link entrance onto the South wing and adjust their route using the Tower A elevator and stairwell.

PRH Receives Knitted Hats For Newborns and Systemic Therapy Patients

A huge thanks to the Centre Culturel francophone de Pembroke for organizing the Wool Arts Project in March 2021. The project was carried out with the support of the Pembroke area community. Participants knitted from home due to COVID-19 restrictions with wool provided by the centre in activity kits. Thanks to the group Les Abeilles, which have been meeting at the cultural centre on Wednesday mornings since September to make hats and small knee blankets, the group has donated to several organizations this month.

Thank you to all who participated; the women of the Bridge group and the Charitas Sisters. As well as Michèle Plath, Chantale Samms and

Pierrette Philion. Their partnership with Teresa McDonald of South Algonquin Knits & Notions allowed them to acquire wool specifically for this community project. Sister Mary and Sister Marjorie made over 200 hats and ten blankets. They also purchased 76 winter hats which were handed over to the French elementary schools in Pembroke. The 400 hats that were made vary in size from premature baby to adult and have been distributed to hospitals in Renfrew County. The 90 blankets were distributed at long-term care homes in Pembroke; 40 to Marianhill, 38 for Miramichi Lodge and 12 for Shalom.
