Today's Take-Aways

PLEASE NOTE - Since next week's Statutory Holiday (Canada Day) falls on a Thursday, next week's edition of The Pulse will be published on Wednesday, June 30th instead.

Regional Updates

• Hospitals in the region are working together in order to determine how they can support each other in addressing the surgical backlog that exists, particularly in the Ottawa area. In addition to this, the province has announced the investment of \$30 million in innovation funding for hospitals to use in order to find ways to get more surgeries and procedures completed. This will be a discussion at both PRH and the regional table.

• Critical care numbers continue to be on the decline along with the number of COVID positive cases which is very good news for our region and the province at large.

COVID-19 Vaccine Distribution

• Big week with five clinics as we manage additional doses of vaccine that have been received in Renfrew County. We are anticipating some busy weeks with similar volumes in the first few weeks of July as well as we work towards a ramp down of the mass vaccination clinics.

 Regional communication around the vaccine rollout is focused on reassurance that the Moderna and Pfizer vaccines are comparable and safe for mixing in terms of first and second dose.

• The health unit will also be starting to look at communications around what will happen with vaccine rollout once the mass clinics wrap up. This is anticipated to happen by the end of the summer.

Occupational Health and Safety/Infection Prevention and Control

 There is ongoing dialogue about regional changes to PPE in terms of the use of eye protection and related to ongoing staff screening.

It is hoped that the province will be providing some updated guidance on this as it relates to both vaccinated and unvaccinated staff. It is also hoped that additional guidance or directives will be received with regards to staff testing going forward and policies around staff returning from travel etc.

Departmental Updates:

Diagnostic Imaging

• Effective July 2nd, the visitor policy related to Ultrasound in particular will be amended to allow an individual's partner in for the gender reveal part of the obstetrical ultrasounds in the last five minutes of the appointment. This practice had been put on hold due to the pandemic and changes to the visitor policy.

Surgical

 The ORs are now operating at 100% capacity however a two-week scheduled ramp down of service will take place starting Monday to allow for staff holidays.

Today's Take-Aways Continued

Acute Mental Health

• Peer workers are starting to return to provide some support to the unit.

Mental Health Services of Renfrew County

• Some staff will be returning to pre-pandemic co-locations to provide support. This includes settings such as the Emergency Department, and the local OPP detachments.

• The Outreach program is transitioning to more of a hybrid model for care delivery – providing some opportunity for group work which is a positive step towards a return to what services were offered pre-COVID.

Project Updates

• 139 new IV pumps were rolled out across the organization today and a total of 158 staff have attended training for the new equipment. Great job to all involved!

• We have some new staff orientating to medical, shout out to **all the staff who have been helping to orientate new staff to the unit**! Rachel


Mental Health Services
