### **Today's Take-Aways**

### **Regional Updates**

• While the work of a number of regional COVID-related committees will continue at this point, a decision has been made to scale back the work of the Champlain Health Region's Incident Command Table – a sign that things are progressing in the right direction. It has been noted that many of the committees have chosen to continue meeting post-COVID as a way of maintaining the partnerships and collaborative efforts that have already taken place.

### **Visitor Policy**

• With changes in visitor policies already taking place in long-term care, hospitals in Renfrew County are exploring the idea of expanding the current policies to allow one visitor per day per patient in addition to an essential caregiver/care partner. More details to come on this.

#### **COVID-19 Vaccine Distribution**

- We continue to see a ramp up taking place in regional mass vaccination clinics and continue to have a steady supply of the vaccine as it is rolled out to youth and we commence the early second dose vaccinations for various age groups and others who are eligible. We continue to work through a variety of issues but overall the undertaking continues to be well received in the community as is evident by the number of sponsors coming forward to provide meals and other offerings to our clinic team as a token of thanks.
- In order to help cool the Pembroke Memorial Centre during the summer months, Valley Refrigeration is providing at no cost to the hospital a 15-tonne mobile air conditioner unit which is anticipated to be in place June 7th. CNL has also offered to provide a generator for its operation.
- Starting tomorrow, Ontario has announced that residents who received the first dose of the Astra-Zeneca vaccine and who have not yet received their second dose can mix COVID-19 vaccines if they want. The decision, made in consultation with Dr. David Williams, the province's chief medical officer of health and other health experts, is in line with updated guidance from the National Advisory Committee on Immunization (NACI). This is welcome news for our vaccination team.

### Occupational Health and Safety/Infection Prevention and Control

• As more PRH staff receive their second dose of the COVID-19 vaccine, much like the annual flu shot, an ask for submission of vaccination receipts from each vaccinated staff member in order to track vaccination patterns for PRH staff will soon be coming. Along with verification of vaccination will also be an opportunity to acknowledge if the vaccination was declined. All of this information will help the hospital in planning for outbreak situations and also evaluating the long-term need for active screening of staff.

A submission window will soon be launched with prize incentives including a variety of products donated by Uline such as Yeti cups, camp chairs, coolers and more! Stay tuned for more details.

### **Today's Take-Aways Continued**

• A recent audit of staff screening will result in increased messaging to staff at huddles and through other communication methods around the importance of performing hand hygiene, wearing a mask at all times indoors and ensuring that everyone stops at all screening stations.

#### Other News:

### **Surgical Program**

• As part of the ramp up of our Surgical program, we are excited to share that we have received approval today to restart inpatient non-urgent (elective) surgeries. This is wonderful news for our patients, our staff and our surgeons. Ramp up of these procedures will begin next week and it is anticipated that we should be able to return to 100% capacity by the week of June 14th.

### **Project Updates**

• The Rehabilitation unit has now been working with the new medication carts for a few weeks. The Rehab staff have been working hard to find solutions that improve workflow. Pictured with the medication cart is Marilyn Adam RN showing the new MAR clipboard that is being trialed. After the initial trial some modifications were made to the clipboard to improve how it can be used to meet our needs during medication passes. The clipboard was added to increase work space on the top of the medication cart.



• Did you know? The hospital has purchased 139 Plum 360 IV Pumps with Drug Library for use across the organization. The pumps

are similar to our current equipment, with the added feature of an electronic drug library specifically tailored to each unit's clinical needs.

The countdown to the implementation of the new IV Pumps is underway! We have picked a new implementation date of Thursday, June 24. This will be the date that our implementation team will come onto the units to swap the old pumps out for the brand new pumps. One of the members of our team will be our Biomed Technician, Jacob Dickerson. Jacob is very excited about Implementation Day as the current pumps are constantly breaking down.

• The hospital hosted a successful kick-off meeting with the general contractor, Frecon, to discuss the Cancer Care Renovation Project. This project will transform former offices on Tower A 5th floor North into new sterile rooms where Pharmacy will prepare chemotherapy drugs and other products. The renovation will bring the hospital Pharmacy up-to-date and compliant with pharmacy standards. It will also provide much-needed work space. The construction schedule has yet to be finalized, but we are anticipating a start date in June with a project length of 24 weeks. More on this exciting development to come!

## **Appreciative Mom Thanks Clinic Team With Chocolate**





## Adding The Staff Screening Tool To Your Mobile Device

#### Android:

Launch Chrome for Android and open the website or web page you want to pin to your home screen. Tap the menu button and tap "Add to Home Screen". You'll be able to enter a name for the shortcut and then Chrome will add it to your home screen. The icon will appear on your home screen like any other app shortcut or widget so you can drag it around and put it wherever you like. Chrome for Android loads the website as a "web app" when you tap the icon, so it will get its own entry in the app switcher and won't have any browser interface getting in the way.

### iPhone, iPad, iPod Touch:

Launch the Safari browser on Apple's iOS and navigate to the website or web page you want to add to your home screen. Tap the Share button on the browser's toolbar. It's on the bar at the top of the screen on an iPad and on the bar at the bottom of the screen on an iPhone or iPod Touch. Tap the Add to Home Screen icon in the Share menu. You'll be prompted to name the shortcut before tapping the Add button. The shortcut can be dragged around and placed anywhere, including in app folders - just like a normal app icon.
