

## **Today's Take-Aways**

#### **Regional Updates**

- Acute care hospitalizations and ICU admissions in the province have continued to decline and there has been some discussion about the possibility of opening schools back up to in-person learning for the last month of the school year. All of this is positive news.
- Long-term care homes in Ontario are expanding their visitor policies to now include two visitors in addition to the residents' essential caregivers. This has not yet been implemented in hospitals.
- Ottawa hospitals are experiencing some relief with increased bed availability and about 130 fewer COVID positive cases in acute care than they had last week.

#### **COVID-19 Vaccine Distribution**

• It is now anticipated that we should have increased regular shipments of the Pfizer vaccine to Renfrew County in the range of about 5,000 doses per week. This, in addition to some anticipated larger allocations of the Moderna vaccine could mean that in the coming weeks Renfrew County will be able to vaccinate approximately 7,000 people per week. As a result, the PMC clinic schedule will soon be ramping up to approximately four days per week.

Based on the county's population and anticipated number of residents wishing to be vaccinated, it is thought that about 90,000 more doses of the vaccine will ensure full vaccination of those individuals. This means that, if all goes well, our mass vaccination efforts may be able to wrap up by the end of the summer!

#### Occupational Health and Safety/Infection Prevention and Control

• Just like any other vaccine, people have had reactions when receiving the COVID vaccine as their body responds and starts to build its immunity. Some of these body responses will mimic the symptoms of COVID and as a result you may fail your screening. If this happens to you or a household member, please contact Occ Health at extension 8200 to discuss your situation and for further guidance. In most cases, staff can continue to work after symptoms are reviewed by Occ Health. If symptoms persist for more than 48 hours, contact Occ Health for further instructions.

Staff are also reminded that you are not considered fully vaccinated until 14 days after your second dose. But even then, this doesn't mean you are immune and you still have to follow all protocols. We know you're tired of all of this but don't let COVID fatigue set in. Be diligent with your PPE, practice hand hygiene, social distance and answer all screening questions truthfully.

#### Other News:

#### **Surgical Program**

• The department continues to ramp up outpatient (day surgery) procedures. This week 50% of the ORs are running and endoscopy is at 100% capacity. Next week the plan is to increase to 75% and 100% the week after. We are still waiting on provincial direction on the ramp up of procedures requiring

admissions, other than those that are cancer-related, urgent or emergent. OR staff who had been redeployed within the organization are heading back to the department.

#### **Diagnostic Imaging**

• The department continues to support Ottawa area hospitals by taking on CT and MRI requisitions as required.

#### **eLearning**

• In an effort to improve timely eLearning compliance, staff will now receive email notification regarding eLearning completion deadlines with reminder notices being issued at 14 and seven days before the deadlines as well as post-deadline messaging if the eLearning was not completed.

#### **Paid Parking Upgrades**

• A new, more modern parking system will be installed in the Deacon Street and Tower D parking lots at the Pembroke Regional Hospital May 31st to June 2nd.

Individuals who have purchased Frequent User Cards for the current system will need to visit the parking office starting June 3rd to receive a new one as existing cards aren't compatible with the new machines.

In addition those staff who have the pink parking passes will also need to swap those for new ones in the SP+ office (room C004, located in the corridor adjacent to Mulvihill Drug Mart in Tower C, Monday to Friday 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.).



# Have you completed your daily COVID-19 self-screening?

## Adding The Staff Screening Tool To Your Mobile Device

#### Android:

Launch Chrome for Android and open the website or web page you want to pin to your home screen. Tap the menu button and tap "Add to Home Screen". You'll be able to enter a name for the shortcut and then Chrome will add it to your home screen. The icon will appear on your home screen like any other app shortcut or widget so you can drag it around and put it wherever you like. Chrome for Android loads the website as a "web app" when you tap the icon, so it will get its own entry in the app switcher and won't have any browser interface getting in the way.

#### iPhone, iPad, iPod Touch:

Launch the Safari browser on Apple's iOS and navigate to the website or web page you want to add to your home screen. Tap the Share button on the browser's toolbar. It's on the bar at the top of the screen on an iPad and on the bar at the bottom of the screen on an iPhone or iPod Touch. Tap the Add to Home Screen icon in the Share menu. You'll be prompted to name the shortcut before tapping the Add button. The shortcut can be dragged around and placed anywhere, including in app folders - just like a normal app icon.
