Regional Updates

• While we are starting to see a small decline in infection rates, hospitalization rates are still very high.

• The province issued new directives to all Ontario hospitals on Wednesday to halt all but emergency/urgent surgeries. As a result, we will be looking to do further ramp downs of our surgical case load effective April 26th. We are hopeful that this will be a short term strategy

• EORLA is making point-of-care COVID testing available to all hospitals in the Champlain region for patient use. Decisions regarding rollout of this testing will be made at the regional level.

• Regionally, meetings on Acute Care have ramped back up with a lot of discussion focused on the topics of patient flow, patient transfers and physician education. Our hospital is ready and willing to take on acute care and critical care patients from Ottawa area hospitals as needed.

Critical Care

• There are currently 800 patients receiving critical care in Ontario and we are seeing a lot of patient transfers from the GTA to Kingston and Ottawa area hospitals. We continue to have capacity to assist our hospital partners in Ottawa and the ability to take over care of some of their patients as necessary.

COVID-19 Vaccine Distribution

• This week our team at the PMC vaccinated approximately 2,200 residents over three clinic days using all three vaccines (Pfizer, Moderna and AstraZeneca). Our vaccination clinic continues to be a high priority initiative for our hospital given that mass vaccination is the only way to put a stop to the pandemic and allow everyone to return to some sense of "normal".

• In terms of second dose notification, everyone will be receiving notification in the next week to two weeks regarding the booking of their second vaccine dose which will be scheduled to be received approximately 14 weeks after the first.

Other News:

Occupational Health and Safety/Infection Prevention and Control

• Just a reminder for all staff to continue to follow universal masking and eye protection requirements. This is mandatory in all clinical areas and in other areas where six feet cannot be maintained between persons. Being vaccinated (partially or fully) doesn't exempt anyone from these requirements.

• With COVID dominating the news and the workplace, it is easy to miss some of the other events that are happening. Next Wednesday, April 29th is one day we should keep in mind. The National Day of Mourning is a day to remember and honour those who have died, been injured or suffered illness in the workplace. We all know the effects COVID has had in Health Care, but for some it has been worse than for others. Please take a moment on this day to reflect. Work safe.

Project Updates

• Kudos goes to the Maintenance staff who did an excellent job in building a containment area in the OR. This was a key step in launching the OR ceiling construction work which starts April 22 and runs for approximately four weeks. The work in the OR is part of the larger Tower D renovation project which will last until the end of July, beginning of August.



• Also, congratulations on the team effort in setting up the Medication Room on Medical. Again, these re-organized, refreshed rooms are part of the hospital's overall medication system transformation.

Intensive Care Unit

• Our ICU is prepared and ready to accept patients from other facilities as necessary and staff from the OR who have been redeployed to work in the ICU are working well with the team.

Diagnostic Imaging

 The department is continuing to support the region in terms of CT scans.



Medication room reorganization


Surgical Program

• The department is in a good position to be able to ramp up or down surgeries and procedures with 24 hours' notice if needed.

Medical Records

• As announced in a memo that has gone out this afternoon, as of April 8th all Outpatient and Day Surgery encounters are now scanned into the Health Information System (Anzer). Additionally, all historical anesthetic records have been scanned into Anzer. Within the coming weeks, the department will be completing the historical outpatient scanning back to Jan. 1, 2021. As records within this timeframe are requested, they will be scanned into the system. All patient encounters should be available in the system within 24 hours of the patient visit.

Additionally, the department has implemented auto-faxing of all face-sheets and triage sheets of all emergency room encounters to our family physicians who have an auto-faxing agreement with us. They will receive these no later than noon the following day after their patient is discharged from the Emergency Department.

Q: Is eLearning mandatory?


