Today's Take-Aways

COVID-19 Updates

• We are continuing to see an increase in the number of admitted COVID-positive patients as well as continued staff infections. Based on the current guidance that classifies an outbreak as two or more COVID-positive cases that are likely to be hospital-acquired, we also continue to experience outbreaks with one currently active on 3rd Medical and a possible outbreak on our Rehabilitation unit.

• Regionally, there are ongoing discussions about the value of patient admission testing for COVID, recognizing that, in the past seven weeks alone, 52% of COVID-positive admissions at PRH were symptomatic patients while the remainder were asymptomatic and were only identified as COVID-positive through admission testing.

COVID-19 Bivalent and Flu Vaccine Clinics For Staff

• We've had a great start to the rollout of both the Bivalent COVID-19 Vaccine and the Flu Shot with staff clinics taking place regularly. A reminder that those receiving the flu shot will receive a ballot for a chance to win \$500 cash in a December 14th draw so don't miss out. Be sure to watch for the latest clinic schedules so that you can drop in for your vaccination(s).

A key part of the accreditation process is completing "instruments" or surveys with staff. This process provides valuable information for targeted improvement to ensure PRH is providing the best and highest quality of care possible.

During our preparation for accreditation, we have completed two surveys: The *Patient Safety Survey* and the *Staff Engagement Survey*. The results of each of these surveys were used to create organizational action plans aimed at improving patient safety practices and increasing staff satisfaction.

The Patient Safety Survey identified that our staff feel there are ways we can do better when it comes to patient safety and incident reporting. The action plan was created and broadly distributed to seek feedback from all staff. Our goal is to ensure that the action plan items will help bridge some of the gaps that staff identified when completing the survey. With action plan work ongoing, we will share our progress through monthly updates in *The Pulse* and ensure that both action plans are available to all staff.

• As part of our recent Code Orange training, representatives from CNL stopped by to review our policies and supply status to ensure that the items needed in a Code Orange situation are up-to-date.

• November's Code of the Month will be Code Green (Evacuation). We will be working closely with the Pembroke Fire Department to schedule an exercise with one of our clinical units towards the end of the month.

• The ED is continuing to work with and expand the role of Advance Care Paramedics who have joined the team as part of an innovative pilot project. Our ICU is also working to enhance the team model.

• The department is working to get regular Lean huddles back up and running while educating our newest members about the Lean culture and how it lends itself to quality improvement.

Obstetrics

• Like Medical, LDRP is also working to revitalize the Lean work being done, starting with the addition of more meaningful improvement ideas. Lots more to come!

In recognition of the upcoming *Canadian Patient Safety Week* that runs from October 24th to 28th, and in the spirit of having Patient Safety as a focus of Accreditation, teams are encouraged to continue to identify improvement opportunities in their departments that directly relate to patient safety and quality of care.

Not only are huddles an opportunity to identify areas for improvement, but they are also a chance to celebrate and recognize accomplishments and team members for a job well-done. Every huddle concludes with a celebration ticket that recognizes teams or individual employees who have gone above and beyond. We know that everyday our teams strive to provide the highest level of care to our patients and we encourage all team members to continue to celebrate and recognize each other.

Tower A:

• Commissioning of the new equipment and systems is still ongoing as part of the 5th floor *Cancer Care Project* for Pharmacy. All the ventilation ducts were professionally cleaned.

• The Surgical Day Care Project is completing work for the new chapel. Asbestos abatement was completed on the 3rd floor in the old OR area and demolition has started. A medical gas shutdown was required on October 13th in order to install new shut off valves.

• Work resumed on the 4th floor LDRP where a new suspended ceiling was installed in the Rotunda. The perimeter walls are being patched and fire-stopped. Mechanical contractors visited the site for quoting the plumbing repair.

• In the new physician lounge, the millwork is being installed.

Tower B:

• The shower floor and drain in the bathroom of patient room A161 was repaired. It was leaking into the ICU.

Tower C:

• The roof replacement work was completed on both sides of the Board room. The main roof is almost complete with the metal flashing remaining. The water leakage issue inside the building was resolved as it was coming from the higher penthouse roof.

Tower D:

• The metal flashing around the roof perimeter was installed last week and the roof work is now complete.

Other:

• Work started on the replacement of electrical wiring and data cables for the parking lot gates. The power and data will be coming from Tower C and no longer from the house at 192 Deacon Street. This will allow for the demolition of the houses in order to create more parking. Additional conduits will also be installed across Deacon Street at the same time for future electric vehicle charging stations.



Emergency Preparedness

On October 13th, there was a planned Code Grey medical gas shut down.

The Materials Management department, Maintenance Department and Management team prepared contingency plans prior to the shut down. The Command Centre followed the Incident Management System for Code Grey during the shut down and all clinical units were responsible for converting patients requiring Oxygen and Suction to portable systems.

The medical gas shut down lasted approximately 2.5 hours and all staff efficiently and effectively responded to the task. This planned Code Grey medical gas shut down provided the Emergency Preparedness Committee with valuable information to support the PRH Code Grey Plans.


