# Today's Take-Aways

## **Regional Updates**

• Regionally, our hospital continues to be in the orange status of the COVID risk matrix while others in our sector remain in green. This discrepancy is the result of our COVID-positive patient and staff numbers which are not seeing as much of a decline as those in other parts of Renfrew County.

### **Vaccine Distribution**

- We are pleased to share that our first round of staff clinics for the Bivalent COVID-19 booster were well-attended this week, with approximately 60-70 staff receiving their vaccines.
- Just a reminder that the current COVID Bivalent vaccine clinics are for staff only. Family members are encouraged to use local health unit clinics or schedule vaccination appointments at local pharmacies.
- We have received word that the health unit now has the influenza vaccine in stock so we will be looking to start flu shot clinics in the next week or two. Stay tuned for more details!

### **Human Resources**

• Given our challenges in recruiting volunteers to assist with way-finding and other roles within the organization, we will be stepping up communications to create a more active recruitment campaign for PRH volunteers.

# Supplies

• While our PPE stock remains stable, we continue to dedicate resources to daily management of items currently back-ordered or unavailable. We foresee these challenges continuing for the foreseeable future and appreciate the patients of those we are working with to secure substitutions and other alternatives.

### Infection Prevention and Control

• In order to ensure PPE compliance and keep our staff and patients safe, team members can anticipate additional education and reminders in the coming days and weeks around PPE compliance throughout the organization.

While we have learned that there may be new PPE guidance documents coming which may reduce some of the COVID-19 safety measures that are in place, they do remain in place currently and will be required unless further direction is given to the contrary.

# Accreditation >

Staff and physicians were asked to complete a "Patient Safety Survey" in June 2022. Results of this survey indicated that there are opportunities to improve some of the safety practices at PRH.

As a result, the Accreditation team developed an action plan to address some of the major concerns identified by staff. This action plan was circulated for review and input from all teams. We would like to thank everyone who provided their feedback and suggestions to expand this action plan and ensure that patient safety remains a priority for PRH.

One of the recurring items brought forward, was a lack of equipment at point-of-care to safely transport our patients (specifically wheelchairs). We have heard this feedback and have taken some initial steps to improve this process. Here's a few things the teams are now working on to ensure equipment is more readily available at the point-of-care:


- Assessment of current wheelchair stock and purchasing additional equipment
- Standardizing the preventative maintenance process for wheelchairs
- Completing departmental 5S processes to decrease waste and optimize productivity

With our Accreditation Survey only 6 months away, we will now be focusing on educating and preparing staff on the Required Organizational Practices (ROP). As we have discussed, there are a total of 31 ROPs for the organization which are categorized into six central themes. Each month we will focus on one category of ROPs and aim to educate/ inform/ and remind staff about how our daily work and organizational goals align with these standards; this will be referred to as the "ROP of the Month".

For October, the ROP of the month is Infection Control. Huddle Board packages on this are being circulated for discussion including September's audit results, seen below.

#### Moment 2 Before aseptic procedure

When? Clean your hands immediately before any aseptic

Why? To protect the patient against harmful germs, including

their own germs that can enter their body.

### Moment 3 After body fluid exposure risk

When? Clean your hands immediately after an exposure risk to body fluids (and although you were wearing gloves)

Why? To protect yourself and the health care environment from any germs you may have come in contact with

### Moment 4 After patient/patient environment contact

When? Clean your hands when leaving:

- After touching the patient or
   After touching any object or furniture in the patient's environment

To protect yourself and the health care environment from any germs you may have come in contact with




# Mental Health Services Team Reconnects And Gives Back

At Riverside Park a collection was taken for the Petawawa Pantry which was co-founded by MHSRC Concurrent Specialist, Laurie Alton.






# Giving Back To The Community Through Holiday Food Drive
