COVID-19

• While Renfrew County's transmission numbers continue to see a decline, we have had a large number of admitted COVID-positive patients in recent days, as many as 16 – some of which are connected to our two current outbreaks. However, this is the most we have had at one time since the start of the pandemic. Despite this, there are currently no changes to visitor restrictions or other COVID-19 safety measures.

Human Resources

• The department expressed gratitude to the Management team for the ongoing work they are doing and their dedication in helping to ensure that the hospital is appropriately staffed despite the challenges we are facing.

Infection Prevention and Control

• Our outbreaks continue on Medical 2A and 3B with a total of 8 patients affected at this time. We would like to thank everyone for their assistance in management of these situations.

• Staff should anticipate some communication with regards to some changes in requirements for eye protection in our clinical areas. While we can't guarantee that these changes will remain place, we are hopeful they will give a little bit of reprieve to those impacted.

Fall Vaccination Program

• Plans are underway for the rollout of the influenza (flu) shot this fall as well as the new Bivalent COVID-19 booster. We are hoping to be able to offer both vaccinations simultaneously to our staff, patients, visitors and perhaps family members. Logistics for distribution of these vaccines and plans to encourage uptake are in development. Environmental Services and Housekeeper Appreciation Week

This week, PRH is recognizing and celebrating the tremendous contributions of our Environmental Services team and the important role they play in the patient experience while ensuring our hospital is clean and safe for all within our facility.

With all the challenges and changes the last few years have brought, these team members have remained resilient in their efforts to protect others and we are grateful for all that they have done and continue to do.



Emergency Preparedness

On July 8th, there was an issue with the air handling motor which triggered the smoke detectors in patient room 6 in our Intensive Care Unit (ICU). The concern over patient safety led the PRH Incident Management team, the Pembroke Fire Department, and ICU staff to the decision that they should do a partial evacuation of the ICU. Three patients were horizontally evacuated to the Emergency Department until the situation was resolved. The post-action debrief identified the following things that went well and where improvements could be made.

What went well:

• Good support from all ICU team members with clear delegation of roles and duties.

• The RN's and RT's jumped into action quickly to support patient care and transport, clerical staff ensured charts were prepared and ready, and Housekeeping retrieved stretchers to support the transfer.

• The Occupational Health and Safety Manager led a mini huddle once a plan was made to identify any missing pieces or safety issues that were not identified.

• The Intensivist on the unit was actively involved in identifying any risks to the patients during transfer and patients were moved in order of highest to lowest risk.

• Everyone remained calm.

• The motor was quickly switched out of the air handling unit in order to regain air circulation in the ICU so that patients could be returned safely.

Identified areas for improvement:

• The need for clearer communication with the ED charge nurse and team.

This was an excellent way to prepare us for the next mandatory vulnerable occupation drill planned for November.
