# **COVID-19 - Regional Updates**

- Public Health is reporting that provincially it appears we have hit the peak of COVID-19's 7th wave and that transmission is on the decline. While Renfrew County's transmission numbers are conclusive, everyone seems cautiously optimistic that we are on a downward trend in terms of case volumes. We are also seeing this reflected in the number of hospitalizations and COVID-positive staff cases.
- Despite the downward trend in transmissions, there continue to be some outbreaks in our region in long-term care settings.

# **COVID-19 – PRH Updates**

• Our internal Command Centre group continues to meet weekly in order to monitor the situation. As reported previously, we get regular updates from Public Health based on a risk matrix and Renfrew County remains "Yellow" which does not necessitate any significant changes.

### **Human Resources**

- As part of a re-launch of our Volunteer program, we are excited to welcome some wayfinding volunteers to our Tower D entrance starting next week. We continue to seek other volunteers for this role in particular and, going forward, we will be working to re-introduce more volunteers to our organization to fulfill various roles that help to enhance the patient experience and support our health care team.

The novel Langya henipavirus (LayV) was found in 35 patients in the Shandong and Henan provinces. Many had symptoms such as fever, fatigue and a cough. We anticipate hearing more about this in the coming weeks.

### **Clinics**

• We are excited to announce that our new Internal Medicine Rapid Access Clinic will be accepting referrals starting August 17th.

Led by Dr. Pierre Zakko, this outpatient clinic will provide urgent access to internal medicine for patients who present to the ED and would otherwise require admission, as well as facilitating post-discharge follow-up for admitted patients. The clinic will be running one to two days per week in Tower D.

# Phase Outline For The PRH Day Surgery and Surgical Inpatient Renovations

## Phase 1

- Prep Work: Asbestos Abatement, Mechanical/Electrical Evaluation and work, medical gas lines, water lines etc. This phase has some organizational impacts, in particular Tower A 3rd and 4th floors.
  - Construction of a new Chapel, Tower A 1st floor (previous offices A120 A121 and A122)
  - Revision of the patient kitchenette on Surgical Tower A, 3rd floor inpatient unit
  - New staff room on 3rd floor link, formerly office B361

Anticipated completion date: January 2023

# Phase 2

- Demolition of North and East wing Tower A 3rd floor (old OR and chapel area)
- Construction on East wing, 3rd floor Tower A to include new procedure rooms (endoscopy, MDR reprocessing for scopes, urology/multifunction suite)
- Construction on North Wing, 3rd floor Tower A to include new Surgical Daycare, Registration Area, washrooms and change rooms

Anticipated completion date: Summer of 2023

## Phase 3

- Demolition of West wing, 3rd Floor Tower A (old endo areas)
- Construction of Ophthalmology suite, Medical Device Reprocessing Areas
- Renovation of South wing, 3rd floor Tower A Inpatient Surgical (improvements to washrooms, addition of isolation rooms, private rooms, revision of nursing station, waiting area)

Anticipated completion date: Early 2024


