

#### **Today's Take-Aways**

#### **COVID-19 – Regional Updates**

- Regionally, community transmission of COVID-19 is on the decline which is great news and we are seeing this reflected both in the number of COVID-positive patients and staff in our organization. As a result, we are anticipating some updated guidance with regards to COVID measures and policies, but we have not yet received anything.
- The Ottawa Hospital is in the process of piloting a new passive screening process for patients and visitors that it hopes to fully implement by the end of the month when the province will no longer reimburse hospitals for COVID-related expenses. Other hospitals, including ours are looking with our regional partners to a standardized approach to passive screening but as of yet, there are no regional timelines for everyone to reduce and/or eliminate active screening.

It should also be noted that, at this time, there are no plans to remove the requirement for visitors to be fully vaccinated. TOH anticipates having this requirement in the form of an attestation should they move to electronic screening for everyone.

#### **Infection Prevention and Control**

- As part of internal guidance from Occ Health and IPAC, we will now be able to use available meeting rooms for the consumption of food and drink in addition to space in the cafeteria and on the cafeteria deck as long as current restrictions and guidelines are adhered to. This includes removing masks only during the time you are eating and drinking, maintaining the required distance from others while unmasked and performing hand hygiene. There are also plans to make the Rehab deck available for staff during the lunch hour for this purpose. Stay tuned for more details.
- We are also anticipating updated guidance on the mandatory admission testing for patients which could result in some changes in the coming weeks.
- While our COVID outbreak on 3rd Medical continues, we are hoping to be able to lift that status as of June 10th so long as there are no further cases.





### **Today's Take-Aways Continued**

#### **Occupational Health and Safety**

- With the nice weather now here (barring a derecho!), and people getting out to enjoy it, it almost seems that COVID is behind us. Unfortunately, it is still present in the community and staff within the hospital are still becoming positive, so we have to continue with some precautions:
  - Staff screening is still a requirement and needs to be done before every shift.
- · Wear the appropriate PPE. Masking is a requirement at a minimum and eye protection is needed with patient interactions and at all times on COVID outbreak units.
- · Symptomatic staff, even those who previously had COVID, should not be coming to work. If you have symptoms, you need to contact Occ Health (extension 8200) for direction.
  - · Keep your distance. Maintain 6' when taking a break with co-workers.

The good news is that there will be changes over the next few weeks that should bring us even closer to normalcy. It is anticipated that there will be further guidance issued by the province in the coming weeks so stay tuned.

• Please note that weekend COVID swabbing for staff and their family members has been paused due to a decrease in COVID transmissions.

#### **Staff Engagement Survey**

- A big thank you to everyone who took some time to complete the recent Staff Engagement Survey. A total of 598 staff participated. Congratulations to the following departments who won prizes for both Early Bird completion of the survey and highest participation rates overall:

  - Large Group(>40 staff) Mental Health Services- 98% Participation

In the coming days and weeks, survey results will be compiled and rolled out to departments for sharing with staff and discussion at leadership meetings and huddles. Survey feedback will help form a Lean roadmap and help to measure Lean revitalization going forward.

The next Staff Engagement Survey is scheduled to take place next winter in advance of our Accreditation process.

#### Tower A:

- Work on the 5th floor Cancer Care Project for Pharmacy is ongoing. Most of the drywall finish work in both sterile rooms has been completed. Work continues in assembling and connecting all the lines from the heat exchangers in the penthouse to the rooftop units outside.
- The 3rd floor Surgical Redevelopment Project is starting this month with the general contractor, Hein, mobilizing onsite. The first phase renovation work will consist of a new electrical room in the 4th floor west wing, a new chapel and office in the CEO's old office, a new staff room and washroom in the Clinical Resource Office on the 3rd floor link and a new IT room in the back of the 3rd floor kitchenette.
- The asbestos abatement was completed in the 4th floor LDRP A442 Nursery. The entire scaffold was taken down and removed.
- Lead-containing floor paint abatement took place in the office of the PRH Executive Director in preparation for new floor covering.
- The terrazzo floor repairs were completed in the new Physician Lounge. Work started on upgrading the electrical and data wiring. The HVAC work continues.

#### Tower B:

• The wall and ceiling were repaired in patient room B376 following a water leak from the roof.

#### Tower C:

- The renovation work for the ground floor Geriatric Day Hospital is almost complete. New cabinets and a counter top are being installed in C017 and the data wiring is left to be connected in the IT cabinet.
- We are in the process of pre-qualifying general contractors for upcoming renovation work for the rest of the ground floor.
- Roof replacement work is starting this month tentatively scheduled for Monday, June 13th, weather permitting.

#### Tower D:

- We are finalizing the details of the *Phase 2 Chemotherapy Project* on the 1st floor.
- Roof restoration work is starting this month tentatively scheduled for Monday, June 6th, weather permitting.




