Today's Take-Aways

COVID-19 - Regional Updates

- Both the Incident Management System (IMS) and Operations structures have been resurrected in the region. Our hospital has senior leadership representation on both.
- There has been a significant ramp up of regional collaboration including the re-establishment of regional communication and committee structures.
 - There is a lot of regional discussion taking place with regards to patient flow and capacities.

Today's Take-Aways Continued

- There is work being done to standardize implementation of various COVID-related policies and safety measures at hospitals as not all implementation is currently standardized.
 - One of the biggest challenges across the region is staff resources.
- Testing volumes have significantly decreased since implementation of new testing guidelines and eligibility which is expected to reduce the turnaround times for the ones that are still being done.

Ontario Health's Directive #2

• Hospitals were provided with detailed guidance around the implementation of Ontario Health's Directive #2 last night. This includes direction to ramp down various non-urgent surgeries, procedures, diagnostic appointments and clinics that could impact a hospital's capacity. PRH will be cautiously ramping down where appropriate based on this guidance.

Human Resources

- An internal Escalation Committee has been established to assess and review specific return to work cases involving staff who are off on isolation due to COVID-19 exposure or being a high risk contact.
- An anonymous survey has been circulated with regards to the impact school closures are having on our workforce. Staff are encouraged to complete this short survey in order to assist the organization with risk planning and to reach out to their manager if any support is required.

• There are no major supply issues to report at this time.

COVID-19 Outbreak On 2nd Medical

• The outbreak appears to be contained at this point. Testing continues for patients and staff. It is hoped that given no additional positive cases linked to this outbreak, that the outbreak could be declared over as early as the middle of next week.

Occupational Health and Safety / Infection Prevention and Control

- We have once again received revised COVID-19 symptom guidelines. As a result, changes to the screening questions both staff and public can be anticipated as early as tomorrow.
- Everyone is reminded to accurately complete their daily screening even if working from home as the screening is linked to payroll and an individual working from home who does not complete screening is classified as non-compliant for that shift.

COVID-19 Vaccination (3rd Dose) Staff Vaccinations

• In response to the rapidly evolving situation related to the COVID-19 Omicron variant of concern (VOC), we are encouraging all members of our health care team to get their third dose of the COVID-19 vaccine as soon as possible.

To those who have already received their third dose – THANK YOU!

In order to assist with organizational risk planning, we would ask that you please voluntarily submit your updated proof of vaccination to Occupational Health as soon as possible by email to occhealth@prh.email.

Community vaccination clinics continue to accept PRH staff and physicians on a walk-in basis with no booked appointment necessary.


Pharmacy


• The region is experiencing a shortage of medication used to treat the severely ill COVID positive patients, however pharmacists are working collaboratively to manage the doses that are available and share as required.






Mental Health Resources Are Available
