Senior Leadership Team

• All staff are reminded of the value of vacation time as it helps to reduce burnout and enables team members to return to work with renewed energy. Human Resources

• As you may be aware, the Ontario Nurses' Association (ONA) and the Canadian Union of Public Employees (CUPE) recently reached a settlement that includes wage increases for their members. To maintain fairness and equity within our workforce, and in alignment with previous practice, we have decided to match the settlement reached by ONA for our non-unionized employees. A memo on this, with additional detail, was issued to our management team on Wednesday to be shared with those in this grouping.

Trillium Gift of Life Network (TGLN)

• Routine Notification is the rate at which hospitals notify the Trillium Gift of Life Network (TGLN) when a patient has died and there may be potential for organ and/or tissue donation. Routine Notification is an important step taken by our team to connect potential organ donors with TGLN. Through the process of Routine Notification, we are able to honour our patients' wishes, recognize donation opportunities and save lives. I am pleased to share that PRH has once again attained a 100% Routine Notification rate for the year 2021-2022.

Organ and tissue donation is a complex process, involving hard work and dedication. Thank you for your ongoing efforts to ensure that families within our community are offered the opportunity to make lifesaving choices.

Occupational Health and Safety

• One of the priorities in our Quality Improvement Plan (QIP) for this year is to reduce incidents of violence that result in injury to staff. Reviewing data is a key part of this and when an incident of violence occurs, it can be confusing on how it should be reported.

After a Code White is called, a Code White report is filled out.

When a patient is violent towards another patient or does self-harm to themselves, a Patient Rims should be filled out.

In all cases, an Employee Rims should also be completed as all of these incidents will involve an employee.

All of these reports serve as data collection for a variety of reasons and for a variety of groups/individuals. Hopefully we can streamline this reporting in the future, but for now it is important to submit it, so that we can get a clear picture as to what is happening within the hospital.

• On July 28th, a Code Black exercise was held in our Ambulatory Clinics. The simulation was well received by staff with good turnout and involvement. Connecting with the CEO - In Case You Missed It

July 28, 2023

While we are all still in summer mode and enjoying the nice weather, I wanted to share with you that this fall our hospital Board, together with us, will be starting to develop a new five-year Strategic Plan.

A planning process like this will only be effective if we have input from all of you as well as our broader community.

All of our annual goals, objectives and the hospital's Quality Improvement Plan (QIP) are based on the direction of the Strategic Plan, so ensuring that our plan meets the needs of our community for the next five years and beyond is paramount.



In addition to the plan's update, we are also seeking to renew or re-affirm our hospital's Mission, Vision and Values statement.

In order to ensure that we do this well, we will need some help from people who have been doing this work with other hospitals in Ontario. Our Strategic Planning Steering Committee is in the midst of engaging an external facilitator to help lead the plan's development.

It is our intention to solicit broad consultation from you, our staff and physicians, and from our community. We will be looking for feedback from as many individuals, community and health care partners, and special interest groups as possible so that, ultimately, our new Strategic Plan will focus on the needs of the patients and families we serve, actively engage our community, be set in a context of providing connected and coordinated health care with our partners, be straightforward and practical, and will enable all of us to develop our annual goals.

The process will involve workshops where the Board and our leadership teams will come together to review the data and feedback we have gathered, start to draft a potential plan and seek feedback on the draft.

Our current timeline sees a new plan to be approved by our Board of Directors in March 2024.

A lot of work will be involved, and we hope to hear from as many of you as possible. This plan is the foundation that will determine where we place our efforts for the future.

I look forward to engaging with you all as part of this important process. Sabine

I wanted to take some time this week to talk about our Emergency Department (ED), and in particular, our ED wait times.

I recognize that many of you, if not most, have had first-hand experience with our ED at some point in time, whether it be through care for yourselves, a family member or a close friend. Many of us have experienced what it's like to have to wait when someone we love is sick and, more often than not, it's natural for us to think that things aren't happening as quickly as they should in that time of need.

Ontario's emergency departments, ours included, are seeing an increased number of visits by patients who are sicker and require more complex care. This is happening for a number of reasons, and because of this, it's not only the emergency departments that are impacted, but also many other areas of the hospital which, in turn, can also impact our ED wait times. For example, when we have no available beds on other units, patients requiring admission stay longer in the ED requiring care.

Connecting with the CEO - In Case You Missed It (Continued)

In June of this year alone, our ED had 2,630 patient visits, 246 of which resulted in admission to inpatient units. These numbers continued to increase through July.

There is good news however! Our hospital is one of 74 medium and large-sized hospitals throughout Ontario to receive funding through the Ontario Pay for Results (P4R) program in order to help lower overall wait times.

Each month, we receive a report based on submitted data which tells us how PRH is performing in comparison with other hospitals. For the month of June, we were ranked 7th out of 74 hospitals in Ontario for two categories - Time to Inpatient Bed (9.9 hours) and Length of Stay of Admitted Patients in the Emergency Department (22 hours). This means that once the decision was made to admit them, 90% of admitted patients spent 9.9 hours or less in the Emergency Department and from triage to admission, 90% of patients requiring admission spent a total of 22 hours or less in the Emergency Department. Although we are still not meeting our internal targets of 5.5 hours for Time to Inpatient Bed and 15 hours for total time in the ED for admitted patients, our hospital continues to make good progress towards those targets.

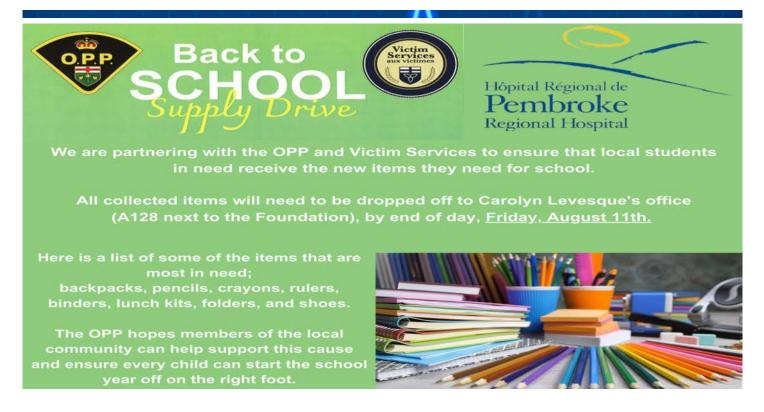
Those responsible for this success includes many of you - the ED Team, our Patient Flow Manager, Hospital Charge Nurses, inpatient units, our physicians, our Allied Health professionals including the Lab and DI, Environmental Services staff, and those in registration – all working together to optimize patient flow.

And, when we combine all wait time category results for June 2023, the Pembroke Regional Hospital had an overall ranking of 32 out of 74 Hospitals in Ontario. This is our highest ranking since April, 2019!

So while we celebrate this success and improvement, it does not stop there.

We know that, regardless of process, our patients arrive in our ED with an expectation to be seen and treated promptly. We will continue to make progress using our Lean process improvement strategies to improve testing times and finding other ways to streamline processes required to help diagnose and treat patients in a timely manner. Each of you is a part of this improvement strategy which will also benefit you and your loved ones when you are most in need.

• Here are some pictures of the progress being made on Tower A, 4th floor. The photos above depict the corridor and patient rooms where ceiling and light fixtures are being installed and painting is underway.

Other construction updates:

• Just a reminder that we will have our three-day Medical Air shut down starting next Tuesday, August 15th.

Tower A

- Cancer Care Project The decontamination and decommissioning of the old rooms has been completed. We are still working through some alarms, humidity, and temperature control issues with the contractors and engineers.
- Regarding the *Surgical Day Care Project*, work is progressing and the terrazzo floor repairs are nearing completion. Most of the drywall has been installed including the headwalls and the lead lining in certain rooms. Asbestos abatement of the textured ceiling finish in the 3rd floor south corridor was completed.
- On the 4th floor (Obstetrics), the electrical wiring in the patient rooms was completed and the new emergency panel was energized. Suspended ceilings were installed in the remaining patient rooms and in the main corridor. Painting has resumed.
 - An access control panel was installed on the half door at the clerk's desk in AMH.

Tower B

• The roof replacement is continuing with the installation of the new roof membranes and insulation.

Tower C

• The *Main Entrance Ground Floor Renovation Project* tender closed on August 1st. The architects are reviewing the bid of the lowest bidder before issuing the contract.

Tower D

• The engineers visited Medical Day Care in order to finalize the drawings for Phase 2 of the Cancer Care Project.

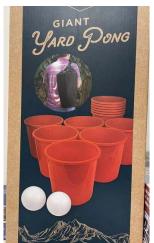
We all benefited from his confidence and trust in our individual skills. We know that we are better nurses, dietitians and mental health workers because of his support of our multi-disciplinary team.
