Senior Leadership Team

• Today and tomorrow we have some guests on site who are assisting us with a visual audit of our public areas. Having detailed feedback from outsiders who are seeing our spaces with fresh eyes will help guide us in making improvements to the way patients and visitors see our facilities. We look forward to sharing some of this feedback at a future date.

Infection Prevention and Control

• As we continue to make changes to our universal masking protocols at PRH, it is important to remember the difference between masking for source control and masking used for personal protective equipment (PPE).

Source Control:

- Using a mask for source control is meant to control the virus at the SOURCE to help protect others.
- It is meant to limit the spread of the SOURCE's exhaled infectious respiratory particles.

PPE:

- Using a mask or respirator for PPE is intended to control the virus at the WORKER level (protecting the person who is wearing the mask or respirator).
 - It is meant to act as a barrier or limit the inhalation of infectious respiratory particles.

Remember to ALWAYS follow posted additional precaution signage and complete a point of care risk assessment to ensure that you are wearing the appropriate PPE to protect yourself from becoming infected with known or suspected infectious particles.

Projects

• Why transform Medication delivery at PRH? Medication incidents have consistently been the top reported type of patient related incidents at PRH. Through the use of Automated Dispensing Units (ADU), improvements will be made in medication storage and tracking, medication withdrawal and transfer to bedside, as well as display of patient and drug information.

Departmental Updates

Information Technology

• Due to technical issues at The Ottawa Hospital (TOH), the email password update scheduled for May 31st has been postponed to June 6th. A memo with further details about what you will need to do starting June 6th has gone out earlier today.

Lab

• Please be advised that the Lab has recently updated their access security. As a result, everyone will need to use their badge to access the main Lab door 24/7.

Maintenance

• Please note that the bike storage area behind the cafeteria is still under construction. The work is scheduled to be completed next week. In the meantime there are bike racks at the staff entrance as well as at the Emergency entrance. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

Medical Program

• All Medical patients have now been consolidated on our Medical 3B unit. While this change has not come without its challenges, we want to thank everyone involved in this transition for their hard work, dedication and patience. We will monitor patient flow on an ongoing basis and we have allocated additional space on the 2nd floor, Tower A, for Medical patients should the need arise. Our priority remains delivering the highest standard of care and ensuring the well-being of our patients.

Surgical Program

• The next step in our Surgical Redevelopment Project will be the move of our inpatient Surgical program and patients to what was 2nd Medical's south wing for a period of approximately 12 months. This move is scheduled to take place on June 8th and we would like to thank all involved for their work to date on this aspect of the project.

Emergency Preparedness

On May 29th, a Code Yellow tabletop exercise was completed by members of the Management team. This exercise was an opportunity for those involved to work through the processes that take place when a patient is missing. Thanks to all who took part.

During the exercise, some improvements to the policy and resource documents were identified. These include:

- Noting if the missing patient has been identified as a risk due to violence on the missing patient description log
 - Indicating on the mission patient description log what steps need to be taken if the patient is found.
- Adding a statement to the bottom of the missing patient description log to shred the document once the Code Yellow has ended.
 - Guidelines for how to interact with the OPP if a patient is not able to be formed.
 - Identifying how frequently an active Code Yellow status (stage 2) should be announced overhead.

Many of you may have noticed that our 2nd Medical unit has been void of patients for a couple of weeks now and instead, all Medical patients have now been consolidated on our Medical 3B unit. While this change has not come without its challenges, we want to thank everyone involved in this transition for their hard work, dedication and patience as we continue to welcome staff feedback on ways to ensure this consolidation works well for all.

In addition, given the reduced number of Medical admissions we have seen in recent months, we have decided to temporarily reduce the number of Medical beds by five for the summer period, starting May 26th.

While this decision was made to ensure optimal use of our resources and provide efficient patient care, we want to emphasize that this consolidation and bed reduction will not result in any staff reductions. In fact, to ensure transparency and address any concerns or questions, we have already met with both CUPE and ONA local executives, and their support in sharing this decision and assisting their members is greatly appreciated.

Rest assured, we will closely monitor patient flow on an ongoing basis and we have allocated additional space on the 2nd floor, Tower A, for Medical patients should the need arise. Our priority remains delivering the highest standard of care and ensuring the well-being of our patients.

This consolidation has also laid the groundwork for the latest phase of the Surgical Renovation Project that requires us to relocate our inpatient Surgical unit to the 2nd floor of Tower A for a period of approximately one year.

The Medical and Surgical teams have been working diligently to prepare for this upcoming move and once again we want to thank all involved and are hopeful that all of the care planning will result in a smooth transition.

In the coming weeks I hope to be able to provide further updates on this and other aspects of construction and renovation including the work being done on the 4th floor Obstetrics areas.

Thank you for your continued commitment to our patients and our hospital. Your efforts are instrumental in maintaining our exceptional standards of care.
