• We're thrilled to announce that, starting December 11th, ECGs will be going live online - an exciting milestone on our journey towards Epic implementation!

An ECG, or electrocardiogram, measures the electrical activity of the heart. It's used to detect heart conditions, monitor heart health, and guide care decisions for our patients.

With this upgrade, ECGs will be ordered on the same screen as lab work, and results will be available online within seconds of completion, directly linked to the patient's visit. This means faster access to information, improved workflows, and reduced reliance on paper.

While paper printouts will no longer be required for every test, they will still be available for STAT ECGs or in Code situations where immediate access is essential.

To help everyone prepare, demonstrations and training will take place from December 2nd to 13th. Be sure to participate to learn how this exciting change will improve patient care and streamline processes!



Highlights From Sabine's November 15th and 22nd Messages

November 15th was an incredibly exciting day for our hospital and for our community as we celebrated the Grand Opening of both our Day Surgery and Surgical Inpatient units.

Many of you may not realize but this Surgical Construction Project, valued at over \$20 million, is the second largest construction project we have seen through to completion, in decades, second only to the creation of Tower B in the mid 2000s.

As part of our Grand Opening Ceremony, we welcomed many of our donors, community



partners, government representatives, project leaders, members of our Surgical team and others into both spaces for some special remarks, a blessing of the space and a ribbon cutting in addition to an opportunity to tour the areas before our patients move in.

This major milestone in our hospital's history represents a significant improvement in both the patient experience and the workspace for our Surgical team and given some of the other transformative work that is going on in various parts of our facility, I think it's going to be a banner year for us in 2025 with so much "new" space and the work we will do to bring Epic online.

Changes In our Leadership Structure

I would like to share with you some changes we are making to our hospital's leadership structure that will take effect December 16th.

As you may recall, Melanie Henderson who has served as our Vice-President of Clinical and Support Services, Partnerships & Integration for the past two years will be starting a new role with the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada in January.

Following thoughtful discussion amongst our Senior Leadership Team, we have decided not to fill this Vice-President role going forward and, instead, we have reorganized the portfolios held by Beth Brownlee, Scott Coombes and Brent McIntyre as well as those of some of the other leaders on our Management team.

In addition, we have decided to advance two of our current Managers, Ralph Hatem and Andrew Keck, into Director roles while Bailey Kehoe will become Manager of HR and Labour Relations.

All of these decisions were made in order to ensure organization-wide stability as we embark on Project Horizon and our journey to Epic which will represent a great demand on everybody's workload.

I would ask that each of you welcome and support those whose responsibilities are transitioning and assist those who are taking on new programs and services as part of their learning journey.

LGI Mobile App FAQ

Q. Why do I have to frequently log into the app?

A. The mobile app locks after 15 minutes of inactivity. You will continue to receive notifications while the app is locked.

Q. Is a list of shift offers and notifications available on the app?

A. Notifications are issued based on your S&A preferences. In addition to viewing the notifications on your phone, you can view the notifications on your S&A dashboard message widget.

Q. Is it important to decline shift offers that I am not available to work?

A. Yes, declining shift offers provides your manager with information to make staffing decisions. Declined shift offers do not count towards scheduled hours.



On November 27th, members of the Senior Leadership Team conducted their monthly Gemba Walk in the new Medical Device Reprocessing area now located on the third floor of Tower A.

There, they were able to speak with MDR team members about the transition to the new space and how it has improved their workflow and daily processes.

Previously, MDR was located on the 1st floor of Tower A, their "pack" room was located on the 2nd floor of Tower D and they were back and forth to the ORs on the 3rd floor of Tower D. Now, they are co-located on the Surgical floor which allows for much improved flow and efficiency.

In addition, their new space has two sinks which means that more work can be done in less time, particularly when it comes to cleaning instruments and preparing them to be sent off site for sterilization.

It was also noted than in urgent situations where additional items may be required in the ORs, there is a much faster response time due to their close proximity.

While some minor improvements are still being made to the new area and the way things are being done, staff overall are very pleased and are especially thrilled to have large windows with a view in their news space.
