Intensive Care Unit

• We are pleased to inform you that the Intensive Care Unit (ICU) at Pembroke Regional Hospital has expanded its cardiac care capabilities. Effective June 3rd, Temporary Cardiac Pacing now includes Transvenous Pacing as part of our critical care services.

Temporary pacing is a short-term method used to control a patient's heart rhythm when the heart beats too slowly or irregularly. A pacing wire or catheter delivers electrical impulses to stimulate the heart until a more permanent solution can be provided or until the condition resolves on its own. Transvenous pacing is a temporary method of endocardial pacing that involves accessing the heart through a central vein.

The ICU at Pembroke Regional Hospital is a nine-bed, closed-access adult medical-surgical unit dedicated to providing high-acuity care for patients who meet established admission criteria.

This update ensures that patients requiring advanced pacing support can now receive timely and appropriate care closer to home within our ICU setting, improving outcomes and continuity of care.

MDR

• On May 23rd, Amber Boire (Quality Assurance and Equipment Coordinator) and Sarah Gibson-McKay (MDR tech) went to Toronto to take part in the CERT (Certified Endoscopy Reprocessing Training) course at the Olympus Training Centre.

This train-the-trainer course on the reprocessing of Olympus endoscopes was done with a combination of theory (didactic) and hands-on-training. The training offers the most crucial aspects of today's dynamic world of endoscopy and endoscope reprocessing, including endoscope care and handling, trouble shooting, occupational health and safety, microbiology, infection prevention and control and quality assurance best practices.

While at the Olympus Centre, both Sarah and Amber had to perform the proper cleaning reprocessing of endoscopes that are a part of PRH's endoscopy fleet.

After successfully passing a final examination and hands-on test, both received their CERT certificate.

OVOHT Provides An Update To County Council On Primary Care Proposals

On May 14th, I was delighted to be part of a delegation to Renfrew County Council in my role as Co-Chair of the Ottawa Valley Ontario Health Team, for a presentation on the status of two primary care proposals which have now been submitted to the province. Should both proposals be approved as part of Ontario Health's plan to create or expand up to 80 primary care teams, all residents without a family physician who are identified through Health Care Connect, would be attached to a care provider by 2027.

Council members were provided with an overview of both proposals as well as an update on the work that has been done to date to improve primary care coverage. This includes the additional number of Medical Residents receiving local training through the Family Medicine Teaching Unit and those who have come to practice in our region as part of the Practice Ready Ontario program – the fact that we have seven of Ontario's 38 PRO doctors providing care within our communities is simply amazing! Response to both the presentation and the proposals themselves was overwhelmingly positive.

Minister of Finance Tables 2025 Ontario Budget

On May 15th, the Hon. Peter Bethlenfalvy, Minister of Finance, tabled the 2025 Ontario Budget with health sector highlights including \$1.1 billion in additional hospital funding for 2025/2026. This is said to include some increase in base and targeted funding however at this point we do not yet know the details and how this will impact our budget. Once we know more, I will provide some additional information.

An Amazing Turnout At Second Annual CEO Breakfast

The Foundation's second annual CEO Breakfast was a tremendous success as I was joined by 100 enthusiastic community leaders, business owners and local donors the morning of May 15th for an overview of the exciting developments taking place at our hospital and our plans for the future of local health care.

Province Announces New Funding To Support Those Who Are Experiencing Gender-Based and Intimate Partner Violence

We are very excited to share that our Mental Health Services Team will be launching a new program to support women, youth and LGBTQIA2S+ individuals living in the Renfrew County who have experienced Gender-Based and Intimate Partner Violence with a focus on employment and financial empowerment.

This initiative will be delivered in partnership with the Phoenix Centre, Bernadette McCann House, the Youth Wellness Hub of Renfrew County, and the Robbie Dean Centre and is made possible through special funding from the Ontario Ministry of dren, Community and Social Services, demonstrating a strong provincial commitment to addressing and mitigating the impacts of violence in our community.

Kudos to our Mental Health Team for having the vision and foresight to apply for this funding which will bring great benefit to some of our community's more vulnerable residents. We look forward to sharing more details about this program further aspects are finalized.

- ICU admissions increased by 10%.
- More patients are going home either independently or with support.
- Fewer patients are being transferred to other hospitals.
- Mortality rates have decreased, a testament to the quality and effectiveness of care

We are committed to increasing the acuity level of care we provide, ensuring that more complex and critical care services are available closer to home.
