

Western Champlain Health Link Communiqué

Health Links = Integrated Care for Complex Patients

The Ministry has communicated that it expects the Health Link approach to be fully integrated into standard care delivery by the end of this fiscal year 2019-20, and will conclude designated funding for Health Links implementation as of March 31, 2020.

In the Champlain region over 50 health service providers are working together to embed the approach into their practice and contribute care coordination supports for patients/clients with complex needs. The Champlain LHIN has committed \$1.04M in base funding to help sustain this and provide a strong foundation for Ontario Health Teams (OHTs). South-East Ottawa Community Health Centre will be the Regional Integrated Care Lead organization for this funding. Pembroke Regional Hospital and all the dispersed partners within Western Champlain will work closely to ensure there is little or no interruption in providing integrated care to complex patients.

Health Links Informs OHT Planning

The Health Links approach has given service providers the permission to step back and re-think how they have been working with a complex patient. It has allowed them the time to listen to the patient, interpret clinical information and provide health literacy teaching, build communication links to other providers, and find creative, local solutions to service barriers and gaps. As Ontario Health Teams develop in our area, the Health Links experience will inform planning for systems navigation and care coordination for all patients.

Health Link care coordination is "different from what I am used to. It doesn't have to be just medical solutions to what I see in the patient's home. Health Links care coordination opens up my brain."

Our Successes and Continued Commitment

In Western Champlain, 1657 patients have received the Health Link approach to care since our beginnings in 2015. For 2019-2020, we project that our health service providers will have worked with 373 patients. This means we are providing the type of experience described by a patient in an October 2017 phone interview. "Mary" said her experience of "Health Links was like a little thread of a web, building to something bigger....I can talk to the care team. The teamwork is so intricately woven, it is just awesome. They help me to connect and will call if they haven't heard from me."



In Western Champlain, twenty health service partners have committed to continue providing integrated care to complex patients. One sign of that commitment is the setting Coordinated Care Plan targets for each agency. As of March 10, these twenty agencies committed to creating 170 Coordinated Care Plans for complex patients for next fiscal year, with more commitments to come.
